AARA	ABSENCE	ACADEMIC INTEGRITY
<p>AARA are provided to minimise barriers for a student whose disability, impairment, medical condition or other circumstances affect their ability to read, respond to or participate in assessment. These barriers fall into broad categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long-term and chronic conditions • Mental health conditions, such as anxiety and depression • Short-term conditions and temporary injuries • Illness and misadventure. <p>What is supported by AARA provisions:</p> <p>Disability:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • cognitive • physical • sensory • social/emotional Plus: • illness • misadventure (unforeseen circumstances that are outside of the student's control, e.g. accident, death of a family member) <p>What is not supported by AARA provisions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • matters that the student could have avoided, e.g. misreading an examination timetable, misreading instructions in examinations • matters of the student's or parent's/carer's own choosing, e.g. family holidays, sporting events • teacher absence or other teacher-related difficulties 	<p>Success in learning occurs when there is a positive working partnership between the student, school and home.</p> <p>When a student is unable to attend school for an extended period, we kindly ask for this to be communicated to the College as soon as possible so that appropriate planning and provisions for assessment can be made if possible. Whilst all learning can be accessed via the student learning platform, we expect students to attend every day to maximise their learning.</p> <p>If a student does not manage to submit a draft they will be expected to attend a scheduled academic support session. These are held each Wednesday afternoon from 3:00pm to 4:00pm. Parents will receive notification of this support being required.</p> <p>As per the QCAA assessment guidelines: <i>`In cases where students do not submit a response to an assessment instrument by the due date, judgments should be made using evidence available on or before the due date'</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Therefore, any <i>failure to submit a required assignment in its final form</i>, without an approved 'Reasonable Adjustment', will result in the <i>assessment of the existing draft/evidence of progress</i> and a grade awarded from this assessment. • In the absence of any assessable evidence of progress/existing draft the student response will be judged as 'Not Rated (NR)', the student will not meet the requirements for that unit of work and will be <i>ineligible for a QCE point for that unit of study</i>. 	<p>Each year, Senior Student are required to complete the QCAA Academic Integrity Course for Students during their induction to Senior Study.</p> <p>In most circumstances, evidence of plagiarism and/or work not attributable to the student will be identified during the draft submission phase. In such cases the teacher will discuss the areas of concern with the student and may require student attendance at Draft Catch-up Room sessions to demonstrate a satisfactory re-write/re-work of their draft (see <i>previous section 'Failure to submit a draft'</i>).</p> <p>Student collusion is identified when more than one student works to produce a response when that assessment item demands an individual response; or when a student assists another student by giving a response to an assessment for the purpose of copying that response.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where evidence of plagiarism, collusion, or work that is not authentically owned by the student is identified in the final assessment submission then <i>only the portion/s of the submission deemed to be the student's own work will be assessed</i> and a grade awarded based on that assessment. This consequence is also applicable where a student has received a response for the purpose of being copied and has subsequently submitted that response (in part or in whole) as their own. • Where a student has provided a response for the purpose of being copied by another student, the penalty for the student providing the response <i>may result</i> in their assessment being 'Not Rated (NR)', <i>pending a review of the circumstances for the academic integrity breach</i>.
